



FYSA Soccer Rules for Parents: Rules of Behavior

Your children are playing soccer for fun. Everyone wants you to enjoy the great game of soccer. This information is being provided to assist you and your children in gaining the maximum benefit possible from these soccer games. Below are some simple rules you should observe. PLEASE CONSIDER THEM CAREFULLY!

1. Do not shout instructions to your child. This only confuses, since the coach has already instructed your child on how to play. If you do shout instructions, your child will probably try to please you and the coach at the same time. In trying to do two things at one time, the child becomes unable to handle his loyalties and ends up pleasing neither parent nor coach.
2. Cheer for your child when he/she plays the ball well. However, remember that your child is a member of a team. Let the other players know you support them, too.
3. Suffer in silence (or moan softly) whenever something occurs that goes against your child's team. A display of anger may inflame a delicate situation, resulting in embarrassment for you or your child. Some parents embarrass their children by making a spectacle of themselves.
4. Do not run up and down the sidelines. Find a comfortable place to sit down or stand, relax, and enjoy the match.
5. Do not shout insults or verbally abuse the referee. It's hard for a child to learn respect for the referee or other officials when their parents set a poor example. The referee can and will stop the match if the crowd becomes discourteous.
6. Aid the team parent by helping provide refreshments at halftime and after the game is over.

Set the tone for good sportsmanship by adopting a positive attitude if your team loses. Compliment your child upon his/her good plays and ignore the mistakes. Your child will be happy that you noticed his good qualities.

REMEMBER--your child will forget about today's game. Next week, he/she will probably have forgotten the score. However, both of you will remember the good time the child had playing the most popular sport in the world.

Fighting, horseplay, or any physical or verbal abuse will not be tolerated. Penalties may include issuing a red card and ejection from the game. The Board may impose additional penalties up to and including suspension from the league.

FYSA Comportamiento y Normas Para los Padres

Sus hijos están jugando al fútbol para divertirse. Todos quieren disfrutar del gran partido de fútbol. Esta información se proporciona en un esfuerzo para ayudar a usted y a sus hijos en la obtención del máximo beneficio posible de estos partidos de fútbol. A continuación se presentan algunas reglas simples que debe observar. POR FAVOR, TÉNGANLAS EN CUENTA CUIDADOSAMENTE.

Padres, no enviaré emails, textos, whatsapp, mensajes de voz o comunicación verbal al entrenador, director deportivo o con otros padres hostigando y/o mostrando falta de respeto a los entrenadores o al gerente del programa; todas las quejas deben ser tratadas respetuosamente y en privado con el entrenador y/o el administrador del programa.



1. No gritar instrucciones a su hijo. Esto solo provoca confusión, porque el entrenador ya ha dado instrucciones a su niño sobre cómo jugar. Si gritar instrucciones, lo más probable es que el niño intente favorecer a usted y al entrenador al mismo tiempo. En el intento de hacer dos cosas a la vez, el niño se vuelve incapaz de manejar su lealtad y termina por agradar ni a los padres ni al entrenador.
2. Animar a su hijo cuando juega al balón. Sin embargo, recuerde que su hijo es miembro de un equipo. Déje que los demás jugadores sepan que ustedes apoyan también a ellos.
3. Sufran en silencio (o con un gemido suave) siempre que ocurre algo que va en contra de su equipo. Una muestra de enojo puede inflamar una situación delicada que dará vergüenza a usted y a su hijo. Algunos padres avergüenzan a sus propios hijos, haciendo un espectáculo de sí mismos.
4. No corran en el margen, hacia arriba y abajo. Encuentre un lugar cómodo para sentarse o ponerse de pie, relajarse y disfrutar del partido.
5. **No griten insultos verbales o abusen del árbitro. Es difícil para un niño aprender a respetar al árbitro o a otros funcionarios cuando sus padres dan un mal ejemplo. El árbitro puede detener el partido si la muchedumbre se pone descortés.**
6. Ayuda al equipo de padres a ofrecer refrigerios en el descanso y después del partido.
7. Fije el tono para la buena deportividad, adoptando una actitud positiva si su equipo pierde. Felicite a su hijo y pase por alto sus errores. Su hijo será feliz de que note sus buenas cualidades.

Lucha, juegos o bromas o cualquier abuso físico o verbal no se tolerará. Las sanciones podrán incluir una tarjeta roja del árbitro y la expulsión del juego. La Junta Directiva podrá imponer las sanciones adicionales hasta e incluyendo la suspensión de la liga.

Key Biscayne Athletics Code of Ethics

I hereby pledge to provide positive support, care, and encouragement for my child participating in youth sports by following this Parents' and Players' Code of Conduct:

1. I will encourage good sportsmanship by demonstrating positive support for all players, coaches, game officials, and administrators at games, practices, and youth sports events.
2. I will place the emotional and physical well-being of my child and all players ahead of my desire to win.
3. I will not harass, taunt, intimidate, or verbally abuse any officials, coaches, or players.
4. I will not get into arguments with the opposing team's parents, players, or coaches.
5. I will not coach my child or interfere in any way with the coach & their decisions; I will always allow the coach to be the only coach.
6. I will always encourage my child, including times when they make mistakes; I will never criticize my child in front of anyone.
7. I will not send any emails, voicemails, or have verbal communication with my coach, Sport Director, or other parents harassing, and /or showing disrespect to coaches or the Program Manager; all complaints must be dealt with respectfully & privately with the Coach and/or the Program Manager
8. I will support coaches, officials, and administrators working with my child to encourage a positive and enjoyable experience for all.
9. I will ask my child to treat other players, coaches, fans, and officials with respect regardless of race, sex, creed, or ability.
10. I will ask my child to treat other players, coaches, game officials, administrators, and fans with respect.
11. I will help my child enjoy the youth sports experience by doing whatever I can, such as being a respectful fan, assisting with coaching, serving as a team parent, or providing transportation.
12. I will not cheer when an opposing team's player makes a mistake; I will also not distract, criticize, or intimidate the other team's players in any way.
13. I will not cheat or engage in any form of unethical behavior.
14. I will not engage in hate speech.
15. I will not come onto the field for any reason during the game.
16. I will not criticize game officials.
17. I shall not possess, consume, or distribute before, during, or after any game or at any other time at the field and/or game complex alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs, or unauthorized prescription drugs.
18. I will refrain from any activity or conduct that may be detrimental or reflect adversely upon FYSA, its members, or its programs.
19. I will ensure that my child and their parents will abide by the conditions of this Agreement.
20. I agree to abide by any rulings made by the Disciplinary Committee regarding violations of the terms of this Agreement.
